PART I - PROCLADE INTERNAZIONALE ONLUS

INTRODUCTION

PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus is a nonprofit foundation for international solidarity legally established in Rome in November 2006. PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus belongs to an international network of NGOs based in European, African and Latin American countries, which actively cooperate with Claretian Missionaries present in developing countries.

At the United Nations, Proclade International Onlus has been recognized as an NGO with special consultative status in ECOSOC (Economic and Social Council) since 2017. It was also accredited to the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) on May 27, 2021. This accreditation conferred observer status to the Environment Assembly and the UNEP branch.

OUR MISSION, VISION AND GOALS

As an expression of Claretian activism and social engagement, PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus is the international focal point for coordinating Claretian projects, promoting and exploring new partnerships and funding projects internationally.

The mission of PROCLADE Internazionale is to promote, together with Claretian partners, the development of the most disadvantaged peoples in terms of human well-being, integral development of individuals, soundness of communities, justice, peace and care for Creation.

This is achieved by providing expertise in the identification, formulation and submission of project proposals, supporting missionaries at all stages of the project cycle. In order to ensure the effectiveness of project proposals, as well as clarity and transparency in the management of funding, the Foundation serves as a direct link between the donor and the beneficiary group, constantly collaborating with field managers both in the identification/formulation of projects and in the submission of interim and final reports (financial, narrative and evaluation)

Activities are carried out with respect for the civil and social rights of citizens in developing countries. The vision that guides our activities and commitment makes us act daily with a view to building justice, peace, and development for all people, especially when violence, social marginalization, economic hardship, health, and deprivation of education undermine human development.

The objectives of the Foundation are social promotion and international solidarity toward developing countries. Our goal is twofold: in developing countries, PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus aims to strengthen cooperation with peoples in distress, fostering their civil and social rights through the promotion of human welfare, integral development of individuals, justice and peace; in industrialized countries, our purpose is to encourage and improve voluntary social service for human growth and

citizen awareness, so as to achieve international solidarity and concrete cooperation.

PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus relies on a community of about 3,000 Claretian Missionaries spread across 70 different countries and divided into 31 Organizations and more than 520 communities. A particularly strong presence is found in Asia, Latin America and Africa.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND STAFF


By statute, the ordinary and extraordinary administration of PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus is the responsibility of a Board of Directors consisting of the President - who is also the Legal Representative - the Vice President and six directors. The Board of Directors meets twice a year.

In terms of operational functions, PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus relies on the work of two full-time project coordinators who are responsible for all phases of PCM (Project Cycle Management), from design to evaluation. They work closely with local managers who are, in turn, the spokespersons for the needs of project beneficiaries.

Specific duties of the coordinators include networking with local project managers; assisting on needs analysis; conducting an appropriate feasibility study for each individual action; identifying possible donors and inviting project applications; producing project narrative and financial documents; coordinating all stakeholders; constantly monitoring ongoing projects in compliance with individual deadlines; and producing interim and final reports for donor agencies. Additional activities include the management of bank data and the production of information materials.

COUNTRIES WHERE WE WORK

PROCLADE International Onlus works with the congregation of Claretian Missionaries who are present in 69 countries on all five continents. Funds raised through the presentation of specific projects are sent by PROCLADE to the various mission sites in Africa, Asia and Latin America. PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus works with its partners in a total of 70 different countries. In the year 2022, project activities were carried out in 14 countries.



OUR PRIORITIES

While supporting Claretian communities located in developing countries, our target group always belongs to the most vulnerable and marginalized sections of society. PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus and its local counterpart, therefore, focus their actions for the human development of women, children, the elderly, the disabled, people living with HIV/AIDS, the unemployed, people who use alcohol and drugs, ethnic minorities and other disadvantaged groups. Special attention is paid to young people, in the area of formal and informal education for the acquisition of skills, improvement of employment opportunities, and active and cooperative participation in society.

SOURCES OF FUNDING

Activities are co-funded by private donors and donor agencies. Funds are sent to Claretian missions in developing countries to carry out social and social-community development projects.

Christian-inspired funding agencies are the main sources of funding for projects implemented by PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus. The project coordinator, based on material provided by the local Claretian counterpart, prepares a project proposal with descriptive and financial sections. Grants are approved after the individual project is accepted and evaluated by the agency. Funds are sent in one or more installments, and budget allocation, as well as the proper implementation of activities, are continuously monitored *in-progress* and upon project completion. Because some funding agencies expressly require direct contact with local communities, in some cases PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus is not registered as an official partner and therefore is not involved in the transfer of funds, despite having contributed to the design and presentation of the project.

Financial aid is also provided by the other European NGOs that collaborate with the Claretian missions and by the local communities of Claretians according to each one's financial ability. They raise funds at specific events. From a financial perspective, until the year 1990 it was relatively easy for European and North American communities to send financial aid to missions in developing countries because communities capable of supporting those in poorer countries constituted a larger number. Over the past two decades, however, there has been a steady increase in the number of Claretian communities in developing countries coupled with a reduction in those in the Global North, so new sources of funding have been needed. This is where PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus stands. In some cases, as with the private agencies described above, direct contact is established between the Claretian donor and the local community after the project presentation.

Other sources of funding are spontaneous donations from private citizens that are raised throughout the year through fundraising campaigns such as organizing exhibitions and cultural events.

There is always a contribution from the Claretian counterpart and local people in the financial plan, thus showing their commitment and that of the beneficiaries to achieve the intended goals. The local contribution is divided into a share provided by the local Claretian community and a share provided by the local people. This contribution is proportional to the financial possibilities of the local community and population, which is why it can take different forms: monetary, property, use of facilities and equipment, provision of services, labor, etc.

AREAS OF FOCUS

PROCLADE International Onlus contributes to the implementation of a wide range of social activities in developing countries, grouped in the following main areas:

- **Education for children and youth** through building schools; providing school furniture; funding scholarships for young adults and school support; furniture and materials for libraries; and entertainment programs for children and youth.
- **Vocational training** for youth and adults with formal and informal education and job placement programs; training of educators and community leaders; provision of learning equipment.
- **Public health** through the establishment of small clinics and medical dispensaries; health counseling and awareness activities; construction of sanitation facilities.
- **Food and water security:** construction of wells and water reservoirs; food distribution; establishment of chicken coops and fish farms.
- **Environmental protection:** climate change mitigation action.
- **Renewable energy:** installation of solar panels.
- **Social integration** through the creation of housing and programs for marginalized groups in society.
- **Women empowerment** through the creation of vocational courses for women to enter the workforce; awareness programs for women's rights.
- **Rural development** through the implementation of training programs for water use, irrigation activities, animal husbandry and agricultural techniques.
- **Construction** of multi-purpose buildings and halls.
- **Communication:** radio; publications.
- **Technology:** creation of multimedia and computer centers; computer courses.
- **Transportation:** purchase of vehicles and means of transportation (cars, motorcycles, bicycles, school buses).

In all our projects we always address cross-cutting issues such as gender equality, human rights and environmental sustainability, as they are essential to a balanced and effective development project. The methodology used for project identification, formulation and implementation is *bottom-up*, considering the beneficiary communities as the real authors of their own development strategy.

ACTIVITIES

To achieve its mission and goals, PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus carries out the following main activities:

1. **To provide expertise** in the various stages of the project cycle, providing support for the identification, formulation, and submission of project proposals to a wide range of donors
2. Contribution to the creation of a culture of solidarity with **public awareness and development training**
3. **Use of administrations at** local, national, European and international levels and international cooperation organizations.
4. **Collaboration** with other agencies that share the same commitment and goals for promoting the well-being of the individual.

PART II - REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES IN 2022

PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus, as its mission, has that of supporting projects for the human development of the most disadvantaged sections of society in developing countries. The funds that PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus receives are donated to social, environmental and socio-community projects that are proposed by local communities or entities in developing countries. In its projects, PROCLADE favors, as a cross-cutting component of all actions, an approach geared toward the reduction of gender discrimination, human rights, the management capacity of those involved, and environmental sustainability as indispensable prerequisites for any effective and balanced cooperation project.

ACTIVITY DETAILS - 1: PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Proclade Internazionale Onlus as a consulting organization has engaged in a number of activities to provide expertise in the field of Development. This service has been provided to the various Claretian Mission Offices present in developing countries. Advice was given to them on how problem analysis, preparation of project proposals, using specific templates and taking advantage of guidance on project writing and reporting should be carried out. In some cases, projects were submitted to funding agencies on behalf of local communities.

2. PROJECT MANAGEMENT POLICIES

The way PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus manages projects has been codified in a set of Project Management Policies, which provide guidance on how to submit project proposals. Templates have also been prepared for use by partner organizations to both draft project proposals and report on them in English, Spanish and Italian.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE - CLAPNET

CLAPNET (CLaretian Project NETwork) is a project management software developed specifically for project management by PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus partners. This platform has been in operation since 2014 under the name INTRANET and in 2017 it was renamed as CLAPNET and made fully functional. All projects assisted by PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus have been entered into this system, which provides a real-time means of communication on all registered projects. In

addition, it includes materials such as forms, news, links and information related to the different activities of the Partners.

All projects that were received at the PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus Office in 2022 are entered into this software to facilitate project management; the total number of projects managed is listed below.

3. STUDENT HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (PYHMP)

In collaboration with Proclade Yanapay, a Claretian partner in Bilbao, Spain, the *Proclade Yanapay Hostel Maintenance Program* (PYHMP) was launched in 2017 in order to reduce school dropout. As per the agreement with Proclade Yanapay, general guidelines were prepared for the execution of this program. The participating Claretian bodies are shown in the table below. A total of 927 students benefited from this program in 2022.

To carry out activities concerning the management of all phases of the project cycle, PROCLADE Internazionale Onlus currently relies mainly on the work of the vice president, a Claretian missionary, and a lay employee.

In 2022, Proclade Internazionale Onlus in collaboration with the *Claretianum* in Rome and the *Mission Project Service* from the United States conducted four training courses in Project Management and *Fundraising*. 287 people from 58 countries participated: Albania, Algeria, Angola, Argentina, Benin, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Chad, Colombia, South Korea, Ivory Coast, Costa Rica, , Equador, Egypt, Germany, Ghana, Guatemala, Equatorial Guinea, Haiti, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Kenya, Lebanon, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mexico, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Palestine, Pakistan, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, United Kingdom, Democratic Republic of Congo, Senegal, Syria, South Africa, South Sudan, Spain, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, United States of America, Togo, Uganda, Vietnam, Zambia, Zimbabwe.

PROCLADE uses the digital platform designed by PRISMA (Project Instruction for Sustainable Management - www.prismacmf.org) to deliver the various trainings and disseminate educational materials.

SRL-PRISMA CMF

On May 3, 2022, the Board Resolution on the establishment of SRL-PRISMA CMF took place. On July 27, 2022, SRL-PRISMA CMF was incorporated with the Articles of Incorporation of SRL-PRISMA CMF.

The SRL-PRISMA CMF administration will work to finalize the process of establishing PRISMA as an SRL and to be operational from 2023. In case of delays, they will be limited only to the first scheduled course PROJECT OFFICES 2023 (April 11-15, 2023, in distance mode).

Upon completion of that course, all activities of PRISMA in its present form will cease to exist and the new administration will issue a reworked Calendar in the name of PRISMA SRL.

DETAILS OF ACTIVITIES - 3: Relationship with interest groups for lobbying and advocacy activities at local, national, European, and international levels

For a long time, depending on the issues, Proclade Internazionale Onlus has engaged in lobbying activities at various levels. Various alerts and information have been generated and circulated with partners regarding Earth Day, Water Day, Refugee Day, Holocaust Victims, Victims of Trafficking and other relevant social issues. Proclade Internazionale Onlus collaborates with other NGOs in Rome and is part of a number of networks working on issues of sustainable development, trafficking in persons, and working with immigrants.

In April 27, 2017, Proclade Internazionale Onlus was granted special consultative status at the United Nations through the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). In response to this opportunity, a full-time staff was appointed to New York to participate in the discussions allowed under the UN Economic and Social Council rules.

Activities of Proclade Internazionale Onlus in the United Nations in 2022

Proclade Internazionale Onlus received special consultative status in ECOSOC (Economic and Social Council) as an NGO in 2017. Thus, the non-profit organization had the privilege to participate in all official meetings, join the United Nations Installation, have the opportunity to lobby and work through NGO committees, also meeting with official government delegations and with NGO representatives for support, participation in debates, interactive dialogues, round tables and informal meetings. Fr. Rohan Dominic CMF is the representative of Proclade Internazionale Onlus to the United Nations and is supported by Fr. Henry Ramírez CMF and Fr. Miguel Angel Velasco CMF. Some of the activities that took place in 2022 are listed below.

3.1. Team

In accordance with the Foundation's desire to intensify its commitment to caring for the environment and combating climate change, Fr. General appointed Robert Omondi Apiyo to the Claretian team in the UN on January 24, 2022. He will represent the Claretian team at the UN Environment Program in Nairobi, Kenya. Miguel Angel Velasco, a member of the UN team, finally reached New York and joined the team on January 11. He was subsequently reassigned to Santiago Province (Spain) in August and left New York on August 8.

3.2. Activities

Through the team, PROCLADE INTERNAZIONALE NGO participates in ten NGO committees on various issues, attending meetings, taking on animation tasks, and collaborating on campaigns and events. These are committees related to issues that are considered priorities (migrants, indigenous peoples, promotion of Sustainable development, human rights...). The presence of a team member in Kenya has enabled the Foundation to increase its participation in meetings and committees dedicated to environmental issues. The Foundation has also applied for accreditation to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)

Along with this, in recent months Proclade has participated in fifteen important meetings or events. Some take place every year. Others represent important moments in the commitment to justice, human rights and care for Creation.

In many cases, organizations like ours may be represented by only one or two people. Groups related to PROCLADE INTERNAZIONALE NGO from more than ten nations, consisting of more than seventy three people, have participated in several important meetings (youth forums; education transformation summit; high-level political forum...). The participation of young people deserves to be celebrated and highlighted.

The team met twice with Claretian coordinators of these issues in Asia, Africa and the Americas. And in collaboration with the General Secretariat for Justice and Peace and the Defense of Creation and the Claretian Family, it has disseminated outreach and celebration materials at nearly twenty world/International days (of education; of women; of forests; of press freedom; of biodiversity; of migrants and refugees...).

On the occasion of World Earth Day and World Water Day, information was disseminated and promoted to all partner organizations through social media and other channels of Proclade Internazionale Onlus.

F. 18th session of the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues (UNPFII)

This is the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic (after 2 years) that the United Nations has organized an in-person meeting. The theme, "Indigenous peoples, business, autonomy and human rights principles of due diligence, including free, prior and informed consent." Thirty chiaravallese and associates from three Claretian Major Bodies (Colombia-Venezuela, DR Congo and Kolkata) registered to participate in this forum. The team played an active role in the NGO working group on mining. We also co-sponsored a side event.

L. High Level Political Forum (HLPF)

Theme: "Improving recovery from coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and promoting full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development." 45 countries will conduct voluntary national reviews (VNRs). 34 Claretian and associated missionaries from 10 VNR countries participated in the HLPF and JCoR-organized training on HLPF for six months.

M. 77th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA 77)

N. UN summit on the transformation of education

The summit was attended by education ministers and officials from 170 countries, as well as youth and civil society actors. 77 Claretian teachers and student leaders attended the three-day Summit.

O. Annual meeting of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank Group

As in previous years, Proclade International organized a series of events and campaigns through the Team. Of note: Earth Hour; Event during HLPF on SDG implementation; webinar on indigenous peoples; Claretian conversation on poverty eradication.

P. Remote mode participation in COP27.

Accreditation to UNFCCC is pending, as official participation was not possible. PROCLADE's participation took place in remote mode. In addition, various updates on COP27 development were disseminated daily to all members of the International PROCLADE Foundation and other contributors.

3.9. Other notable facts

Proclade International ONLUS continues to collaborate with religious at UN (RUN) and Coalition of Religious for Justice (JCoR) on various issues and activities. The team coordinator (Rohan Dominic CMF) has been appointed as a member of the JCoR Governing Council, which consists of 20 organizations.

The team carried out constant follow-up work and dialogue with the Security Council on the situation being experienced by Haiti and Colombia. To this end, meetings were held with official representatives of some 40 countries.

The team headquarters in New York received several visits, including that of the president of our Foundation, who took the opportunity to hold several meetings and visit the United Nations headquarters in New York.

During the year 2022, the Foundation significantly increased its presence in forums related to environmental issues. Robert Omondi, from UNEP-Kenya, took part in more than 20 forums related to events such as the Conference on Oceans (UNOC); Decade for Ecosystem Restoration (UNEP); Youth Assembly on the Environment (Global Youth Environment Assembly)
